ONTARIO COMMAND FACT SHEET MAY 2016  
(Fiscal Year 2015-2016)



The Legion at work in Ontario:

- There were 403 Branches, with a total membership of over 100,000 (Response of survey from Ontario Command Branches was 378 branches)
- For the year 2015 Grants from Poppy funds to Ex-Service Personnel and Dependents totaling \$847,164.82
- Additional Funds spent on Veterans Programs for 2015 totaled over \$2,000,000.00
- Not including funds spent on Veterans, over \$386,100.00 was used for Senior Programs
- Continues to provides a Provincial Service Bureau for all Veterans and

Ex-service personnel to assist with pension applications and benefit concerns, this is an ongoing process; with this service being free of charge.

- Our Ladies Auxiliary members raised over \$966,000.00 for donations to charities and other deserving projects in 2015
- Ontario Provincial Command Branches and Ladies Auxiliaries Charitable Foundation donated \$523,662.00 to Ontario communities in 2015
- Through our Bursary program in the 2015-2016 academic year a total of 500 applications were awarded to needy students for post-secondary education in the total amount of \$250,000.00 in the Province of Ontario. Since the academic year of 2002-2003 to 2015-2016 our Bursary program has made a total of 10,567 awards in the total amount of \$5,219,325.00.
- Additional Bursaries from Poppy funds in the amount of \$635,846.00
- Other Donations from Poppy funds in the amount of \$5,276,036.00
- Sponsors and facilitates low rental housing for senior citizens
- Branch and Ladies Auxiliary members visit Veterans in hospitals and continue to supply comforts and entertainment to enhance their quality of life
- Continues to Sponsor Cubs, Scouts, Guides, Cadets and other youth programs. Money spent for Youth Programs was over \$1.3 million; this does not include money from Poppy funds.
- Other donations to local Charities amount to over \$1.3 million; this does not include money from Poppy funds. Donations spent to local Communities totaled over \$1.9 million.
- Total Donations made to the Homeless Veterans Project - "Operation: Leave the Streets Behind" amount to over \$1,550,000.00
- Ontario Command Volunteers annually put in over 364,500 hours
- In 2012 Ontario Command Branches had over 7100 volunteer staff and employed over 1600 full time and part-time staff
- Ontario Command Branches offered their facilities free of charge to community groups for over 31,900 occasions in 2015



I know our Veterans thoroughly enjoyed themselves and the company of one another reliving stories of days long ago.


Our Cadets were very thankful of this experience and to accompany so many Veterans, and hear their stories, it most certainly will be memorable to them.
