	Branch 340 Executive Officers Annual Reports	
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Each year at the Annual General Meeting in April, your Executive Officers present their annual reports to update the membership of what has been happening in their respective committee positions. As the Branch is unable to hold any General Meetings as per Ontario Command COVID-19 protocols, I have included them in this bulletin for your convenience. Your Executive Officers have been conscientious in their duty and working together to keep the Branch viable. They have been successful in ensuring that all Branch business, financial and otherwise, has been taken care of to the best of their ability during this stressful pandemic.

Please note the information provided in the reports was pertinent at the time of submission.

PRESIDENT – Robert Harrison

Like all Legion Branches, 340 has had a very slow and costly 6 months with the resurgence of COVID-19 and having to close for the second time. During the shut-down however we have managed to complete a few renovations including resurfacing the bar tops; putting in new flooring in some areas and redoing the downstairs bathrooms. Our volunteers have done a great job.

We also assisted the Air Cadets financially to relocate their trailer as it was requested by the Bluewater District School Board to remove it from the high school after being there for over 10 years. It was relocated to the Southampton site and is being joined with the already present 3

trailers to form their new base. It is a little out of town but no other spot was available. We wish the Squadron the best in the future.

Branch 340 held a very successful Poster & Literary contest with over 100 entries. Our Public Speaking competition unfortunately was cancelled.

Remembrance Day was also very successful however very different than in past years. Our Church service was videotaped and then was live streamed to the public. Our Cenotaph Service was also live streamed and was very well received.

We held our annual Christmas Raffle and proceeds will be earmarked for our community youth programs. A successful Christmas Toy Drive with gifts for the children in our community was held.

The Ladies Auxiliary donated to our Cenotaph Fund and to the Branch. We thank our LA for their ongoing support.

The Branch also received support from the federal government and these funds will be used to offset expenses and to support our Veterans and our community.

We are open Monday to Saturday 3:00 – 7:00 pm and Friday from 3:00 – 8:00 pm and closed Sundays. At the time of writing this we will be having Meat Draws on Saturdays and safety protocols will be in place; a maximum of 50 in the Branch. This should help get us back on track and making money once again.

The Games Room is open to members only and they have been taking advantage of the time together.

We have held our Executive Meetings and all Branch business is up to date.

I certainly hope we will be back to normal soon, but only time will tell. I thank the Executive, our volunteers and members for their ongoing support during these difficult times.

POPPY – Alex Taylor

With the challenges the Covid-19 pandemic presented, Port Elgin Legion's 2020 Poppy Campaign, unexpectedly, was highly successful raising over \$41,300.00, over a 44% increase over 2019. Through our Ad Mail Campaign, Port Elgin households and businesses donated over \$10,500 alone to the Poppy Campaign. Again, a campaign this large could not come off without the support of our dedicated Branch Member volunteers who stuffed Ad Mail Envelopes and Canvassed at stores that had sufficient space to allow for Canvassers to properly social distance and the many Port Elgin businesses who displayed over 107 Poppy boxes collecting funds for this year's Poppy Campaign. Our businesses and organizations even with the negative impact of COVID -19 still sponsored 104 wreaths, another key to the success of this year's Poppy

Campaign. Thank you to all those who purchased wreaths or made donations. Our Veterans rely on us and the Poppy Funds, we raise, to assist them in their time of need.

As a result, 9 donations to date exceeding \$22,000 including a local Bursary have been approved by our Executive for Veterans and their families, one still subject to Ontario Command's approval. Current Poppy Trust Fund balance before the donations and bursary payments is \$54,540.16.

The call for canvassing volunteers was again answered by a number of our dedicated members. Due to the significant funds raised by our Canvassers distributing poppies in stores as well as the generous contributions to in store Poppy Boxes.

MEMBERSHIP – Dan Kelly

This year has just flown by due to the pandemic situation and the fact that our Branch was closed for a few months (March to July 2020 and December 2020 to February 2021). Our Branch Executive have been working to help maintain our facility and membership as well as keeping all our comrades informed of what is happening. Hope you are all well and staying safe while we work through getting our vaccines. I know of quite a few people that have either

gotten or are scheduled for their first shot. Thanks you all for helping us get rid of this virus and maybe get our lives back to some sort of normality.

Membership has been steady this year thanks to our members. Our membership status is as follows:

Membership Status 2021

New and Reinstated members – 14 members have joined our Branch in the past year

Affiliate Voting Members – 66 of 78 members have paid their membership dues for 2021

Associate Members – 219 of 250 members have paid their membership dues for 2021

Life Members – 13 of 13 members have renewed their membership (it is automatic for Life members)

Ordinary Members – 56 of 60 members have paid their membership dues for 2021

Deceased Members – 14 members have passed away in the past year. Their support will not be forgotten. **“We will remember them”**

Total to date – 354 of 401 members have paid their membership dues for 2021 with 47 members still outstanding that have not renewed their membership this year.

Letters have been sent out reminding people of their outstanding renewal however, some letters were returned back due to incorrect address. If you have changed your address in the past two years please let us know of the change so we can keep our records up to date.

COVID has been devastating for many residents and business around the world, but I am proud to say that our Branch 340 has remained strong and has continued its support to those that have depended on us in the past. Everyone take care of each other, stay healthy, and most importantly never forget. We will remember them.

YOUTH EDUCATION – Patty Kelly

As we all know 2020-21 has been a challenging period for everyone. Working through this time with our President Bob Harrison and the Executive Committee has been a positive and most appreciated experience.

Unfortunately but wisely the Public Speaking Competition both locally and provincially were cancelled for the year of 2021. We were still able to hold the 2020 Annual Remembrance Poster and Literary Competition.

Kudos must be extended to the students who were enthusiastically willing to participate in the competition while receiving the support from their teachers and parents. A sincere thank you is extended to our volunteers who remained dedicated and committed to the program. Socially distancing and safety protocols were applied at every step of the competition.

A total of 155 entries were received of which forty-three (43) student entries were recognized and awarded with financial prizes. The schools that participated this year were the following: Bluewater District Board Remote School, Ecole Port Elgin Central School, Northport Elementary School, St. Joseph's School and Saugeen District Senior School.

In the Zone C-4 Remembrance Competition Branch 340 had four (4) entries placing. Two (2) of those entries received First Place with one in the Junior Colour Poster and the other in the Junior Black and White Poster Divisions. The First Place entries went on to the District C Competition with a Branch 340 entry placing Third in the Junior Colour Poster Division.

All together we got through this year and offered a meaningful Remembrance program to children and youth in our local school system. The Poster and Literary Competition is an act of Remembrance.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our bartenders for their continued support to our Branch as they do a lot of volunteer work behind the scenes. As we are still experiencing COVID, the bar hours have been shortened; we are open Monday thru Saturday from 3:00 pm – 7:00 pm / Fridays we stay open until 8:00 pm.

Eventually when the dart and pool leagues get started back, we will stay open longer. At this time, we can only allow 50 patrons in our clubroom due to the Provincial Health Guidelines; we have developed a Workplace Safety plan in accordance with the Health Department and have contact tracing when you come in to the clubroom – please sign the book with your name and phone number.

Practice social distancing / wash & sanitize your hands frequently and join us for some hospitality – it's been a long winter and it's nice to come to the Branch and see your buddies!

PUBLIC RELATIONS – Rhonda Harrison

As with the state of the COVID-19 affecting all Branches and our own lives in general we all wait for the time when we can be back together celebrating and enjoying each other's company.

At Branch 340 we have tried our best to accommodate our members and of course staying within provincial guidelines and the many protocols.

It has been a very quiet year for functions, etc., as I am sure we can all attest too. Hopefully this will soon be behind us and we can come again to some type of normalcy.

2020 events which the Branch hosted and participated with:

- Branch Poster & Literary Competition was held and we did receive a good amount of submissions from the schools.

- Christmas Raffle tickets were on sale with proceeds going towards youth programs in our community and the draw was held on December 19, 2020.
- Our Poppy Campaign began on October 30th and the pinning of the first poppy was given to Cde Chris Kemp who served in the Korean War.
- Members of the Branch and Colour Party attended the Remembrance Day service at the Tolmie Presbyterian Church on November 5th to record our portion of the service which was to be made available to the community via live streaming.
- Our Remembrance Day Cenotaph Service was attended by persons as per the COVID-19 guidelines. This was also live-streamed to the community. At the Branch, Honours & Awards were presented. Donations from the LA President were also awarded to the Branch and Cenotaph Fund.
- The Annual Christmas Toy Drive was another successful endeavour thanks in part to Meridian Credit Union.
- 2 Meat Raffles were held and the upmost safety was considered for all members and staff.
- The Branch is presently open with limited hours and protocols are in place for members and guests.

At present the Branch is open to restricted hours and the Games Room is open to members only, with guidelines to be adhered to. The calendar for the monthly Meat Draws is now available with dates subject to change.

After COVID-19 when the Branch is open on a “normal” basis and regular hours we will continue with the weekly card groups, bingo, meat draws, barbecues and the Games Room will again be open to the Pool and Dart Leagues.

CHARITY – Rhonda Harrison

The Charity Committee met to review the budget and annual donations.

2020-2021 Charity Budget is \$10,050 and annual donations of \$4,600. A budget of \$1,000.00 is set aside for miscellaneous charitable items.

These amounts have decreased considerably compared to last year but we haven’t had any lottery revenue during this pandemic year. We only hope that once we are back to a more normal state of operations, we can carry on our donations and community support as in the past.

Due to the generous support of our Poppy Fund and the Ladies Auxiliary, our 2 local hospitals have received funding for a total of \$13,000; Saugeen Memorial Hospital - \$7,000 and Owen Sound GBRHS - \$6,000.

Background:

Last year, our donations to eligible charities and the community were approximately \$27,000; this year, our projections are considerably less because of COVID and the lack of being able to fundraise through our lottery accounts.

PROPERTY REPORT – Don Dudgeon

Although our Branch is experiencing the pandemic like every other Legion, it was a good opportunity to upgrade some parts of the building – there is always something to do or fix and keeps me quite active and “young”.

This term, we have accomplished the following:

- A new AC/Heat pump was installed on the roof
- A new lift was put in to take the beer upstairs to the bar
- The back entrance received new flooring, carpet and stair treads
- The men’s washroom in the clubroom was upgraded with new self-flushing urinals, toilet, flooring, new lighting, mirror and fresh paint
- The ladies’ washroom in the clubroom received a new look with fresh paint and new flooring and new lighting
- New flooring was installed behind the clubroom bar / new hinges on the bar cooler doors
- The bar areas were sanded and re-varnished – thanks Bob Harrison
- The shuffleboard was sanded and re-varnished – thanks Marshal Dolbeck
- The Annex driveway was repaired

Before the end of my term, the following will be accomplished:

- Will have the back lot professionally swept and the parking lines painted
- Whirly Bird will be installed on the roof
- The siding at the front of the building – this will conclude the upgrade of the outside of the building
- Parging at the front of the building

Throughout this term, I have put in countless hours either fixing or upgrading the building and would like to thank Paul Dennison for painting where necessary and Nelson Bailey and Marshal Dolbeck for giving me a hand installing the flooring; It’s now time to relax a little and hope you enjoy our Branch

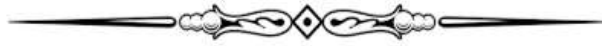

The Branch Secretary is an Officer of the Branch and can be either elected or appointed. They are a voting member of the Executive Committee if unpaid. If paid they are not able to vote at an Executive Meeting but can vote as a member at a General Meeting. They are the scribe, the organizer and the co-ordinator of the Branch and attend all regular and special meetings and complete an accurate account of all business transacted. They prepare agendas for meetings, take notes and record all business in minutes that they then keep safe and perpetually stored.

They dutifully log and reply to all the correspondence and answer any questions from higher levels of the Legion. Working with the Membership Chair they keep an up to date membership list of all categories and keep the Branch profile current, passing along to the Provincial and Dominion Commands any changes to the Branch President or Secretary. They also provide the updated Branch Profiles to the Zone Secretary following Elections in which the Secretary has a significant role, remaining at the Head Table while all other officers are asked to leave.

The Branch Secretary plays a key role in the Complaints Procedure of Article III as outlined in the General By-Laws. They bring all complaints to immediate attention of the Branch President and acknowledge receipt to the complainant as either being properly lodged or not. They also serve a copy of the properly lodged complaint on the member against whom the complaint was lodged. In all instances they keep an accurate record of any proceedings involved.

Secretaries provide an essential service within the Legion at all levels and sometimes we forget to show them the appreciation they so rightly deserve. They are the custodians of the Branch or upper Legion levels and responsible for maintaining records of all the business conducted. If those records were not properly looked after then chaos could well take the place of order.

We owe them a debt of gratitude and I want to acknowledge all the Secretaries in our Zone for their contributions at this opportunistic time of celebration. Thank you for your dedication.

CAF - COMMAND TEAM UPDATE LETTER

"You may recall that earlier this year we communicated our intended plans for the upcoming summer 2021 activities. At that time, we were actively planning on offering a combination of some in-person activities - centered primarily on the generation of personnel and qualifications to fully re-activate the program (when the time is right) and to ensure its long-term sustainability, plus local daytime activities and virtual training courses. Although these plans are sound, their execution is based on a permissive COVID environment. While the national pandemic situation remains fluid and asymmetric across the provinces, territories, and our regions, we continue to hope that there will be an increased improvement over the coming months such that we will be able to revert to a complete in-person paradigm before too long. The safety and security of the youths who participate in our programs is always my top priority.

This, combined with our commitment to developing in youth the attributes of good citizenship and leadership, makes it clear to me that Canada's Cadet Program could not, in good faith, carry on with our planned overnight summer activities this year. This is why I made the decision to cancel all overnight in-person cadet training activities for the summer of 2021.

This was not an easy decision, nor was it made in isolation. The Canadian Armed Forces have always done everything they can to support our programs, from providing medical support, instructors, and facilities which allow us to deliver our top-quality summer training programs. The reality is that the Canadian Armed Forces remain focused on the mission to continue to

protect Canadians during this pandemic – including the delivery of the vaccine to their personnel and to Canadians, while executing its mandated operations at home and abroad.

In reaching the decision point, I want you to know that I have engaged in comprehensive consultation to ensure that I am taking a measured response to the challenges we face. But to deliver on this intent, I will require Cadets, COATS personnel, our volunteers, and key stakeholders - including League representatives, to continue to work together to help generate a 2021 Summer Cadet Program that is as engaged and as vibrant as the conditions permit, to include localized in-person daytime activities - where health measures permit, and virtual courses.

I understand that many of you will be disappointed with today's news. I certainly wish that we had been in a position to offer more. However, the safety and security not only of those involved in our programs, but of all Canadians, must be our top concern. I am confident in the strength and resilience of the people who not only support and lead this program, but participate in it.

Throughout the year, I have seen first-hand through my visits, the passion and commitment to the program, and the creativity and unique approaches to make the best of the unprecedented situation we are in. I am extremely proud of all Cadets and adult staff with how you have continued to lead the way.

Our role now is to continue to demonstrate leadership and citizenship in the face of adversity. I continue to be inspired every day by your passion which is key to our success, and I know that you are all up to the challenge.

"Stay safe. Stay healthy."

The #340 Griffin Air Cadet Squadron looks forward to its continued Legion collaboration, successes and a very hopeful path moving in a positive direction this spring and summer. The Squadron wishes everyone the brightest of days, good health and happiness.
