Leadership & Development FACT SHEET April 2019 (Fiscal Year 2017-2018)



The Legion at work in Ontario:

- There were 399 Branches, with a total membership of almost 100,000 (92% of Ontario Command Branches responded to this survey)
- Total Poppy Donations received for 2017-2018 were \$5,368,572.32. Statements throughout the Fact Sheet reflect where these funds were disbursed by Branches to support Veterans, their dependents and greater community
- Funds spent on Veterans Programs for 2018 totaled over \$2.7 million
- Branches and Ladies Auxiliaries continue to support the Homeless Veterans Program - "Operation: Leave the Streets Behind". As of March 2019 over \$2.3 million has been disbursed in support of 719 Veterans being assisted (of which 71 were female Veterans) in 147 communities
- For the year 2018 Grants from Poppy funds, to the Royal Canadian Ex-Service League in the Caribbean totaled \$90,950.00
- Provide funding for Provincial Service Bureaus, for Provincial Service Officers to assist, all Veterans – Currently Serving and Ex-Service Personnel, with pension applications, benefit concerns, on an ongoing basis - free of charge



- Ontario Command is very proud to support "Operation Service Dog"! In collaboration with Wounded Warriors Canada this program has, and will continue, to drastically improve the lives of many Veterans!
- Branch and Ladies Auxiliary members visit Veterans in hospitals and continue to supply comforts and entertainment to enhance their quality of life
- Money Spent on Medical Equipment and Research totaled over \$1.3 million.
- Not including funds spent on Veterans, over \$557,000 was used for Seniors' Programs
- Ontario Provincial Command Branches and Ladies Auxiliaries Charitable Foundation approved \$521,682.00 to Ontario communities in 2018. Since its inception in 1979, donations approved amounted to over \$16,959,922.52 to various Hospitals, Health Clinics, Homes for the Aged and Charities in communities throughout Ontario.
- Through our Bursary program in the 2017-2018 academic year a total of 452 applications were awarded to students in need for post-secondary education in the total amount of \$338,500.00 in the Province of Ontario. Since the academic year of 2002-2003 to 2017-2018 our Bursary program has made a total of 11,484 awards totaling \$5,790,325.00
- Additional Bursaries from Poppy Trust funds were awarded in the amount of \$725,115.08
- Sponsors and facilitates low rental housing for senior citizens
- Continued to support accessibility for Veterans, their families and the Communities in excess of \$443,000
- Continued to support Boy Scouts, Girl Guides, Army/Air/Sea/Navy Cadets and other Youth Programs in excess of \$1.3 million
- Other donations to local charities amount to over \$1.5 million, not from Poppy Trust Funds
- Donations to local Community Projects totaled over \$1.3 million
- Ontario Command Members annually put in over 444,500 volunteer hours
- In 2018 Ontario Command Branches had over 6552 volunteer staff and employed over 1300 full time and part-time staff
- Ontario Command Branches offered their facilities free of charge to community groups for over 27,600 occasions in 2018





Poppy



Preparations for our **2021 Poppy Campaign is underway and will run from Friday, October 29th to Thursday, November 11th.**

Again, with COVID -19 still providing some challenges, we expect that we will have to do things a little differently. Personal canvassing will have to be at a distance with masks/gloves worn and a separate table (i.e. a folding table) will have to be set up to hold the Poppy Box so social distancing can be maintained and the money insert holes will have to be made a little larger so that donations can easily be deposited by those making the donations.

Approval for Air Cadets to participate in the Poppy Campaign has been delegated to the RCSU (Regional) COs and they will be able to authorize based on local COVID and PHM conditions.

Again, we will have an Ad Mail Campaign. Envelopes and return Donation envelopes pre-printed along with a small information insert which I expect will be ready by the end of September. This mass mailing campaign for our Legion will require very strong Branch member volunteer support and to date I really appreciate the number of new members who have offered to help as well as many of you who have helped in the past. It is a big job and any new volunteers will be gladly accepted to put together the 4,600 Poppy Campaign mailing packages needed to be sent to Port Elgin households. We expect to have afternoon and some evening sessions to assemble the mailing packages as well as Poppy bags for our



counter Poppy boxes (100+ will be needed). An email schedule with further details will be sent out to all those who volunteer as soon as we receive the printed materials. The actual Ad Mail packages will be delivered to the Post Office on the afternoon of October 28th so that they are in the mail for the start of the Poppy Campaign, Friday, October 29th.

Hopefully, we can count on your support this year by volunteering to put mailing packages together and/or as a canvasser where needed.

Uniforms are not required to canvass. All canvassers will be provided with Volunteer Ribbons. Canvasser sign-up sheets will be set up in the Legion's Club Room starting Oct. 1st. **Canvassers, if you sign up on the Boards in the Club Room, please also confirm your sign-up dates and times to me via email so that I can track any canvasser double bookings.**

Guidelines to meet COVID-19 requirements will be provided such as the wearing of masks, gloves (where required) and social distancing (2 metres).

Why are personal canvassers so important? First, donations doubled to quadrupled when a live canvass volunteer was present vs. an unattended Poppy Box. In cases, where corporate policy will not allow us to put a Poppy Box(es) in a store, it increases our collections from that location from 0% to 100% when a canvasser is present.

Our 2020, Poppy Campaign successfully raised over \$41,000, a 48% increase over 2019. Again, to date, we have provided funding or donated over \$22,500.00 in support of our Veterans and their families. A very determined effort by our Branch will be required to repeat last year's success!

The success of our COVID-19 Poppy Campaign in 2021 more than ever will rely on you, our Poppy Campaign mass mailing and canvasser volunteers.

Please send me an email expressing your interest in Volunteering and your contact details. I look forward to hearing from you. I will ensure that you will be personally contacted and offered a role. Your time will be greatly appreciated to make our 2021 Campaign another success!

Youth Education



The students are back in their classrooms with some continuing with virtual learning. The Remembrance Day Poster and Literature Competition information packages have been e-distributed to the principals with a hard copy package delivered to each school.

This past September 30th was the first National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, a Federal Statutory Holiday. Ontario chose to not declare this day a Provincial Holiday, therefore, the students would have been in the classroom. In the past many schools, businesses and organizations already recognized this day as Orange Shirt Day by sponsoring events and reflecting. I was aware that Orange Shirt Day was an Indigenous grassroots movement to honour the loss of children and for those who survived the Residential School system. What I needed to do was to research the origins of the Orange Shirt Day which I discovered relates to the experience of Phyllis Webstad on her first day at the St. Joseph's Mission residential school in British Columbia. She proudly wore her new orange shirt on her first day of school. On arrival to the school her clothes were all taken from her and sadly the orange shirt given to her by her grandmother was never returned. In my readings I found that the Orange Shirt is now a symbol of the stripping of the Indigenous children's identity with the losses from the Canadian residential schools.

There were 140 Residential schools in Canada with the first ones opening in 1931 with the last one closing in 1998. Creating a federal holiday was one of the 94 Calls to Action in the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Report 2015. Cited from the Government of Canada website Canada.ca

How did you recognize and reflect on the National Day of Truth & Reconciliation? If you want to learn more read and ask questions about our Canadian history of the residential school system.

Please mark your calendar for our first meeting in many months and we have lots to discuss – Tuesday, October 12th at 7:30PM in the upstairs Legion hall.






NEW MEMBER SEARCH

Plaque Unveiling - September 4, 2021



Held In front of the Saugeen Shores Municipal Offices on Tomlinson Drive.
Hosted by the Saugeen Shores Municipal Heritage Committee

Approximately 100 people gathered at 2 p.m. on September 4 for the unveiling of an interpretive plaque that honours the Ladies of Saugeen Township, Saugeen First Nation, Port Elgin and Southampton that served in the Canadian Military in WWI and in WWII.

The event began with the march in of an 8-person colour guard from the Port Elgin and Southampton Legions. After the singing of the National Anthem, Saugeen Shores Mayor Luke Charbonneau welcomed the folks gathered and paid tribute to the 19 Ladies that were to be honoured.

Bill Streeter, Chair of the Heritage Committee was the master of ceremonies. He spoke about the lives of the ladies while they served in the military starting with the two Nursing Sisters that served in Europe in WWI. This was followed by the stories of the 17 ladies that served in the Canadian Women's Army Corps and in the Royal Canadian Airforce in WWII.

In attendance was Vivian Winnifred (Sees)Wotton, who was born and raised in Port Elgin and served in the RCAF on the West Coast of Canada in WWII. Later this September she celebrated her 98th Birthday.

Vivian was joined by Mayor Charbonneau, Vernon Roote of the Saugeen First Nation Council and Bill Streeter in the unveiling of the plaque. On the plaque are pictures of the ladies and details of their military careers. There is also the details of women's military service to Canada during in the two wars.

The plaque is conveniently located very close to the entrance door to the Municipal Office and the Plex. Make sure that you take a minute to view it on your next visit.
